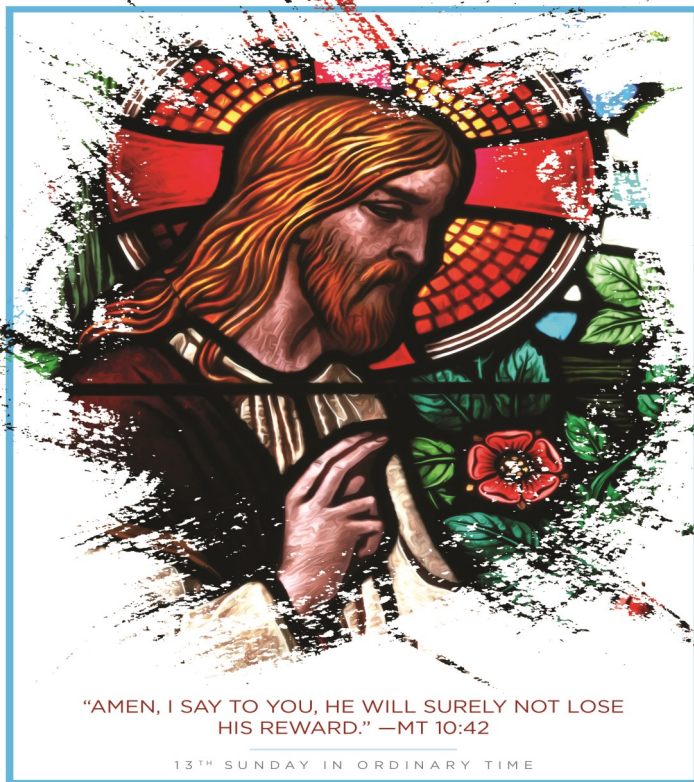

## Father Jim's Thoughts for the week...



**Have you heard of the need as a Catholic to learn to follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit in your day? Would you like to know what that is and how to get better at it?**

What is it? Following the promptings of the Holy Spirit means that I am prayerfully listening to the gentle nudges the Holy Spirit places in my day toward *Action* to do something good that is of God's Will or to *Restraint* to avoid something that is not of God's Will. I call this *exercising the spiritual muscle* of the Promptings of the Holy Spirit. This is the spiritual muscle that helps me to recognize God's direction for the path of my day and life. **This is not a theological definition, but is a spiritual metaphor** I like to use that has helped me to listen more closely to God's will in my day. I think of this as a *Spiritual Muscle* and it is easy to let this muscle become atrophied (unused and weak). Let me give you some tips I find to be helpful in strengthening this most important muscle.

1. I must be praying daily. I must have a habit of prayer in tact that I don't skip. A proper focus for a daily habit of prayer should be on the *time* spent with God; Ideally throughout the day. For example, praying my daily rosary is about committing the time with God contemplating His Divine Plan for salvation, not how perfectly I recite each prayer contained in the holy rosary. If you get distracted in prayer, refocus on the time itself. Think to yourself, "This is time with God, I can refocus on things that are of *His Will* for this amount of time."
2. It is essential to practice what I call Covenant **Action** and Covenant **Restraint**.

**The Action** means doing good things when I recognize the opportunity for them by the Holy Spirit's prompting.

*Examples:* Witnessing about my faith in Jesus Christ, helping someone in need, giving encouraging words to someone who needs them, inviting someone to return to Mass who has drifted away when an opportunity is presented to me to do so.

**The Restraint** means recognizing opportunities to restrain from things that distract us from God or harm us. *Examples, gossiping about someone to others, taking joy at the expense of another person, overspending or overusing any material good of this world beyond it's appropriate measure.*

Both of these practices help strengthen my Spiritual Muscle or Promptings of the Holy Spirit Muscle! Then, I am more able to see and experience the Guidance of the Holy Spirit for my day and my life!

I hope you and I can both practice our Covenant Action and Covenant Restraint today! Remember its about practicing this, not about becoming perfect at it in a day! Practice makes perfect in the long run!

**Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner**

**Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 2Kings 4:8-11, 14-16; Psalm 118; Matthew 10:37-42**

**Prayer of the Day:** *God, through you Son, Jesus, you reached out to people in every kind of need. Use us in the same way, so that by our words and actions, others may feel the power of your love. We ask you this through Christ, our Lord.*

How welcoming are we? Do we make people feel welcome when they come into our home? Do we make people feel welcome when they come to church? How do people make you feel welcome? Let's look at the first reading from the 2 book of Kings. The prophet, Elisha, was traveling and spreading the Good News. There was a wealthy woman in the one town Elisha visited a lot and she always had a meal ready for him. Then she realized Elisha was a very holy man and so she and her husband prepared a special room in their home for him to stay when he was in the area. Elisha was so appreciative that he promised the woman that by this time next year, she would have a child even though she was older. (and she did). In the Gospel of Matthew, being welcoming is also stressed. Jesus reminds the disciples and us "Anyone who makes you feel welcome, makes me feel welcome. And anyone who welcomes me, welcomes the one who sent me..." The disciples traveled many places to share the word of Jesus, but they were not always welcome where they went. But, the ones that welcomed the disciples and what they had to say, welcomed Jesus. We have many who share the word of Jesus now and we should welcome them as well. Many times we think of those sharers of God's word as catechists, lectors, or priests. But, we need to remember we are also called to be ministers of the word. We can share the words of Jesus, we can serve the poor, or we can stand up for what is right. Be a welcoming people as Jesus was so that others will see Jesus' love in us.
