

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...



Have you ever heard someone say, "I'm addicted to Exercising?" Or, something else that is generally viewed as good?

Examples:

- "I'm addicted to walking or running."
- "I'm addicted to Fresh Fruits and Vegetables."
- "I'm addicted to getting proper sleep each day."

Sometimes we might feel annoyed by those statements from individuals especially if we don't share those *healthy addictions so to speak*. And let's be honest, no matter how healthy it sounds, an actual addiction to anything of this world is never good and usually needs adjusted or re-calibrated. I want to share with you something that *would* be a good *Addiction* so to speak. I don't know if I have ever heard anyone say that they are addicted to this before.

Here it is... "I am addicted to turning to the Lord in all things and waiting for Him to provide the Manna/Spiritual Food that I need to be satisfied." Can you imagine someone saying that? Can you imagine being so seasoned in the spiritual life that no earthly reward could compare to the fruits of what God's provides both here on earth and in anticipation of your true home in Heaven? Well, I think we can agree that some, most, or perhaps all of the Saints got to this point in their spiritual life in one way or another. I know that I'm not there yet in my spiritual life. But this is my goal... and I hope it can be your goal too! Perhaps the way to move closer to this goal is to practice doing things more often without the expectation of any earthly reward. One tangible way to practice this is to make all of the actions in your day a prayer in and of themselves. See the example in Red Below! Try to make your work/Labor a separate prayer in and of itself today!

 - 7. Praying my Daily Intentions, Joys and Sufferings

Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner 🧟



Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time - Exodus 19:2-6; Psalm 100; Matthew 9:35-10:8

Prayer of the Day: Ever loving God, you care for all people but especially for all those who suffer. We give ourselves to you that you may work through us for all who are sick or sad in our families and our schools. We ask you to do this through Christ, our Lord.

Many times we read in the Bible that Moses and others go up to a mountain when they want to talk with God. The first reading is again one of those times. God reminds Moses that He saved the people from the Egyptians and brought them to safety. God also tells Moses to remind the people that they are loved and cared for no matter what they go through. God is there for them always. In the Gospel reading, we hear about Jesus traveling and spreading the Good News and healing those who were sick. Jesus realizes there are many people who are like lost sheep and feel like they have no one who cares about them. Jesus compares those people to a "big harvest" and says to the disciples that there are not enough people to do the work. So, He tells disciples to go out and find the "lost sheep" to tell them "the kind of heaven is near" and to heal those who are sick or have evil spirits. Can you think of anyone today who does this? Do we have people in our parish who find the "lost sheep" and help those who are sick? Most of the time when we ask this, we think of our priest.
