

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...



Do you find yourself struggling to pay attention during prayer time?



Do you read your prayer book or the daily Mass readings and find yourself lost in the long and at times repetitious wording? Let me offer you a good technique I use to help me focus!

- 1. Grab a word or idea in prayer. Think of yourself as fishing for good words. When you are reading, grab onto a word or phrase that strikes you and hold it in your mind as you read for a few moments.
- 2. When you are praying the Rosary, try to grab a different word in the Hail Mary with each decade you pray. Example: Hail Mary full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, **Mother of God**, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death, Amen.

Notice how I highlighted "Mother of God." For this decade I am grabbing the thought of Mary's mother-hood of Jesus, and focusing only on that as I recite. In the next decade, I might grab the words; "Pray for us sinners," and focus on the joy that our spiritual Mother can pray for me and meditate on where I need prayers the most for my spiritual growth.

This same method can be used for praying by reading scripture or any other prayer. It even works with Hymns. Try this method of grabbing words or phrases to mentally freeze and meditate on as you pray. This is a good way to anchor into prayer and receive better clarity during the time we spend with God each day!

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity - Romans 8:14-17; Psalm 104; Matthew 28:16-20



Prayer of the Day: God of all people, thank you for your gift of the Holy Spirit to us and the whole church. Through the power of your Spirit, may we tell the whole world about Jesus; forgive those who have hurt us, as we have been forgiven; and live a happy life, doing all that you want us to do. We pray this prayer through Jesus, your Son, who lives with you and the Holy Spirit.


