

#### Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner



Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Isaiah 55:10-11; Psalm 119; Matthew 13:1-9



**Prayer of the Day:** God of all that exists, plant your Word in our hearts, and may it take root and grow there. We want to be your good soil, producing a harvest of kindness and love, so

leading others to find you and give themselves to you. We make this prayer to you through Christ, our Lord.

What does the above prayer say to you? What does it mean to be "your good soil"? The Gospel reading tells us one of the parables of Jesus. It is the life story of a seed, and in this story the seed represents God's word. Jesus and the apostles were traveling to spread God's word and how we are to live to be closer to God. Sometimes it wasn't easy to explain it to the people and so Jesus liked to use parables to make it easier. This time He used the planting of seeds to try to explain. Most of us are familiar how seeds grow, and what kind of soil is needed for that seed to grow and produce vegetables or fruit. As we read the gospel, we see that not all of the seeds were able to grow. There were many obstacles: lots of rocks, not very deep dirt, too much sun. BUT, then there were the seeds that fell on the good direct and had just the right amount of sun, rain, etc. What happened to those seeds? They grew and produced A LOT! Now, if we think of God's word as the "seed", what kind of ground are we? Will we be the stones where the word cannot grow? Will we be the ground where it starts to grow, and then withers because of too much rain or not enough sun? Or, will we be the good ground where God's word can grow and then be shared with others?
