

Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Wisdom 12:13, 16-19; Psalm 103; Matthew 13:24-30

Prayer of the Day: God of Gentleness and power, to build the reign of heaven you work through ordinary, simple people. Use us as your helpers. Though we are young and weak, you can fill us with your strength. Though we sometimes do wrong, you forgive us when we turn back to you. Listen to our prayer which we make to you through Christ, our Lord.

Today's focus is kindness and patience. Neither is an easy virtue. In the first reading we hear that God loves everyone and treats everyone with justice. We may hear people say that they don't like someone or don't have patience for someone. But, God would like us to be like him and try to recognize that everyone struggles with something and we all need to be loved and forgiven sometimes. God shows us mercy when we make mistakes, and so we need to show mercy to our fellow people. The gospel refers to patience. We are willing to be active and do things, but there are times we need to just wait. Not everything can be rushed. For example, let's look at the gospel where the woman mixes the yeast, flour and other ingredients to make bread. She actively mixes in each ingredient and then carefully kneads the dough. But, then she must wait. The yeast needs to do its thing and make the dough rise. That takes time and cannot be rushed. People are like that as well. For someone to grow in faith in God, we can talk with them and share our love for God and Jesus, and then we wait. Do they want more information? Or, are they still trying to decide what they need to know. You cant rush love. When they are ready, they will ask. In the meantime, we continue to show our love to others and be an example of what God would like us to be. Show the kindness mentioned in the first reading, and then wait as the woman did when she was baking bread for her family. It takes time for things to grow whether it be seeds in the ground or love in people's hearts.
