

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...



Have you ever had a rough day or a day that causes you to think, "What am I doing wrong, Lord?" Where have I strayed? This is good! If you are asking the Lord where you have gone wrong, the Lord is now invited to answer your prayer! I call this accepting correction from our Loving Father! Now, we all have bad days and challenges in the wilderness of life. This is just part of living in a fallen world. (The Wilderness) My point here is different than just regular challenges in life.

If you are attending Sunday Mass weekly, praying regularly, and putting effort into your relationship with God by your time; this message is for you. Pay attention if something stressful shows up in your life. Sometimes this is what I call correction from the Lord, and it is a *gift* not a *curse*!

Example: Something stressful happens and causes me discomfort and is strong enough to seem unwarranted. Perhaps I get a flat tire on the way to an important meeting and I have to call my boss and show up late. Now this *could* be just a normal event and I can accept it as a cross of my day which we all have and pray about as such. (Remember, it is good to pray your daily crosses/thorns.)

But... It could be an opportunity to pray asking if this is correction from your loving Father in heaven.

Correction from the Lord stings but does not dismantle. It hurts, but does not scar. It causes me to reengage in prayer to talk about this thing and see if I have drifted off the path a bit. I like to compare this to rumble strips on highways. A rumble strip is there to alert drivers when they drift from their lane. It is there to protect drivers not to harm them. Think about the Lord's correction in this same way. If something stressful happens in your day that seems odd, pray about it! If it is a spiritual rumble strip, ask the Lord; "Where am I straying off my lane in my spiritual life?"

Have I been slacking in prayer? Have I been embracing worldly things... and in doing so, am I becoming less interested in spiritual things? Have I been neglecting time with God that I formerly found joy in spending?

Let the Lord answer you in a quiet space or in Church. Just make sure to ask! I find that the Holy Spirit is very willing to give clarity if it is a rumble strip you have stumbled upon! Spiritual rumble strips are a gift of correction and an opportunity to re-engage in your spiritual life! The Lord provides them to keep us safe on the path of light when we start to stray!

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time - Isaiah 22:19-23; Psalm 89; Matthew 16:13-19

Prayer of the Day: O God, in doing your will Jesus, your Son, has built the church on the work and prayers of men and women around the world. Join our work and prayers to theirs, serving each other in any way we can, so that the church may be a family of love. Listen to the prayers of us all as we make them through Christ, our Lord.

The above prayer says the church is built on the work and prayers of men and women around the world. These are faith filled people and these same people know who Jesus is. Each of us is called to know Jesus, and to know Him we need to have a personal relationshiop with him.
