We have been praying for our parish family members at Church of the Resurrection, especially since the start of this pandemic.



When public Masses were placed on hold in early March and many health restrictions were in place, we made sure to post all applicable signs and updates at all of our church sites, including updated schedules for private prayer and sanitization protocols staying up to date with all available information we received.

We shared all applicable updates on our social media Facebook page, maintained our weekly bulletin and administrative operations, and posted instructional videos on our social media platform when public Masses resumed.

Also shared were a number of reflections in our bulletin and social media to provide words of hope in a much-needed time. We maintained office operations to answer all calls and/or concerns, sacramental requests, and questions regarding the pandemic.

We also began a call-out program ministry to the elderly and homebound in our parish. We maintained safe and clean environments in all of our churches in our large geographical area for times in private prayer and for public Masses when they resumed on June 1.

Capital Improvements

Your contributions to our parish help to maintain our facilities, so they remain centers of prayer and worship in our communities. Over the last five years, we have provided upgrades and maintenance to all of our church sites. We are working to create a detailed list of all facility improvements made over the recent years to be made available on our website.

Most recently, we installed a brand new power box in Rossiter Church and Rectory updating our control and supply to the proper modern safety standards.

In Glen Campbell, we provided much needed window replacements and through the generosity of a kind parishioner, we have received a brand new, state of the art parking lot.

In Ernest, a new light and light pole have been installed. A renovation to the gazebo is underway. The basement has been cleared and more renovations are in the works. Mini split air conditioning units were installed within the last two years in the church that provide additional air conditioning and heat. Ernest also received the first of the brand-new signs to be installed at all sites.

Heilwood received a brand new, state of the art digital bell control system. A lot of cleaning out and proper maintenance has been done here as well.

In Clymer, the entrance to Gilead Hall was completely redone and made handicapped-accessible within the previous three years. The steps outside of the garage have been recently replaced, both Clymer site garages have been organized and completely redone for festival storage and general church maintenance supply organization.

Clymer received an upgrade with mini split air conditioning in the church social hall less than two years ago. The front handrails were painted. These are just a few of the many improvements that have been made most recently and within a few years.

All sites are receiving dedicated workdays in which much needed painting, minor repairs, and upgrades are provided.

Ministries at Church of the Resurrection

Altar Server

Altar servers assist the priest in preparing for Mass. The servers take part in the liturgy by performing tasks to help the priest celebrate the Eucharist. Children who received their First Holy Communion can be altar servers. (Temporarily on hold due to COVID-19).

Liturgy Arts and Environment

Assist with the arts and environment needs of the church throughout the year. The group offers ideas, talents, and the valuable hands-on assistance to help create the beauty of our worship space.

Choirs & Cantors

Provide musical support of full and active participation in the liturgy. (Temporarily on hold due to COVID 19).

Communion Ministers to the Homebound

These ministers assist the priest in the distribution of Holy Communion. (Temporarily on hold due to COVID-19).

Sacristan

Sacristans are charged with the care of the sacristy, the church and their contents.

Ushers, Greeters, Ministers of Hospitality

Ushers take up the offertory, distribute bulletins after Mass and assist as needed with emergencies or other necessary concerns.

Greeters welcome those who are attending Mass.

Ministers of Hospitality are new to the parish. They help assist ushers at each Mass and also assist those attending in fulfilling the special expectations that need to be observed in light of the pandemic.

Marriage Sponsor Couples

The parish is in need of couples to share in the preparation process for engaged couples as they ready for the sacrament of matrimony.
