

# A Spiritual Mother and Father



Did you know that you have a Spiritual Mother and a Spiritual Father? Do you ever struggle in your prayer life? At some point in recent years in my own spiritual reading I learned how to ask the Blessed Mother (our Spiritual Mother) and Saint Joseph (our Spiritual Father) for assistance in prayer. Why is this important? The Blessed Mother and Saint Joseph want to guide you to their Son, Jesus. They want to give you nourishment as you strive to grow closer to the Lord. They want

to help you learn how to grow in your prayer life. These two perfect parents in the spiritual life are waiting for you to ask for their help. They are patient and they know the path to Jesus Christ. Try asking them for assistance when you are stressed in your prayer life. If things don't seem to be going well, or you feel stuck, ask them for help. This will not take away from your prayers to God the Father, for God the Father entrusted Mary and Joseph to raise, nourish and safeguard his Son Jesus on earth. God desires this same assistance to be present for us in our spiritual life. If you want to grow closer to Jesus and need some assistance, remember to turn to your spiritual parents in your prayer time!

The clergy shortage in the Diocese of Greensburg is widely known. In fact, in the next eight years, we will have fewer than 15 native-born priests to serve the Diocese of Greensburg. Without priests, there is no Eucharist. Without the Eucharist, there can be no Eucharistic Revival. This month, Bishop Kulick's Faithful Challenge is to pray for vocations. He encourages you to join him in prayer to spur the renewal of the Church.

This year, Bishop Kulick accepted three more men into the priestly formation program for the Diocese of Greensburg: Matteo Arcara, Thomas Oldenburg, and Ryan Scavnicky. They are now in what is termed the Propaedeutic Stage, a new stage just recently added to the priestly formation program. During the Propaedeutic Stage, Arcara, Oldenburg and Scavnicky will live in community with other seminarians. While introductory in nature, the Propaedeutic Stage is time for the three to grow in their relationship with Christ, trust in God and knowledge of the Catholic Church and Her teachings. This time helps seminarians to lay a foundation for a new way of life centered in Christ and in communion with his Bishop, presbyterate, and his local Church

## Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner



Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time – Ezekiel 33:7-9; Psalm 119; Matthew 18:15-20



Prayer of the Day: Loving God, we have come together to thank you for your great goodness, to beg you to forgive the things we have done wrong, to ask your help to live as we should. Remind us always that 23% SUNDAY Jesus is with us, joining in his prayers with ours. So, it is that we pray this prayer through Christ, our Lord.

The readings as well as the psalm all have the same theme running through them. We are to warn people not to do evil, follow Gods will and share goodness. How do we do this? Ezekiel tells the disciples they have a serious responsibility to guide their community in doing right, and if they do not, then the prophets will be held accountable. The gospel reading is similar in that it says if we notice someone is doing something wrong, we should go talk to them about their choice. If they continue doing wrong, we are to go back to that person with others and see if we can help them make the correct decisions. We are also reminded to pray about them and the situation in hopes of them changing their decision. Sometimes people will think about it, and then make a different choice. Remember Jesus says..."... wherever two or three people are gathered together in my name, I am there with them."
