Father Jim's Thoughts for the week...



What's your weakest prayer? Focus on that!

Are you lacking peace in prayer lately? Are you fulfilling your committed time with God in prayer but finding less spiritual affirmations? Once a month, I love to go before the Lord and ask what I need to work on for this month. I write down a few notes as I discern them. I ask the Holy Spirit to assist me and Saint Joseph to pray for me. Saint Joseph has become my favorite Saint! Joseph is also my confirmation name! Over the next day or two, I prayerfully narrow it down to one or two areas I need to refocus on in prayer. This month I have prayerfully discerned to put extra focus on my *Glory Be* prayers in my breviary and during the Rosary. Why? I have found that because the *Glory Be* occurs so many times in my day, I rush this prayer too much and it can cause me tension. I am going to refocus on my cadence and attention I give to this most awesome short prayer for November. Try this with me for the month of November. Pray about your weakest thing. Ask the Lord; "What should I refocus on for November?"

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end, Amen!

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time: Malachi 1:8-10; Psalm 131; Matthew 23:1-12



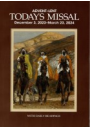
Prayer of the Day: *God, our Maker, all people are important to you and you despise no one. Do not let us think we are more important than others, but makes us more like Jesus, who loved especially those who were rejected. May we understand better that to know we really need you is to be filled with your gifts. We pray this prayer to you through Christ, our Lord.*

We have all been created by the same God who wants us to follow him and serve others. Many times we are told what we should do, and yet that person does just the opposite. It is very hard to follow direction from someone who actually does the opposite. So in Malachi and Matthew today, they both say to do what is right and follow the laws of God even if those who are telling us to do not. Sometimes people will do the right thing and then brag about what they have done so others will know. That is not what God wants us to do. Yes, we are to help others but we are not to call attention to what we have done. Do not try to make yourself be important because you are serving others. We are called to be humble when we serve. Humble means you are doing it because it is the right thing to do and we are not expecting any special recognition for it. God asks us to serve other and we should do it willingly.
