

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...



Third Sunday of Advent



Question: "Sometimes I have difficulty connecting my call as a Catholic disciple to my prayer life. In other words, what is God's purpose for me?"

Answer: This is a question that is relevant whether it is our first day as a committed Catholic or if we have been praying daily and practicing our faith for 50 years. The answer is that you and I are called to testify to the Light.

Today's Gospel reads, "A Man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. -John 1: 6-

God called John the Baptist to an incredible vocation in preparing the way of the Lord in human history, but his vocation is not far removed from our own. God calls each of us to testify to the Light of Christ and prepare the way of the Lord in our surroundings. Let me offer 5 ways we can better fulfill this call in our daily life.

- 1. Tell people you will pray for them who are struggling, or for their friend who is struggling if an opportunity arises.
- 2. Make the sign of the cross in public before meals in prayer or when you pray in your car.
- 3. Say simple things about your own faith in casual conversation with people at work or elsewhere, like where you go to Church.
- 4. Carry a rosary with you in your pocket or purse so that you have a tangible sign of your Catholic faith which is a great conversation starter (and) practice praying that rosary daily if you don't already!
- 5. Model the lives of the saints. Choose a saint to read about and memorize certain aspects of their journey of faith. If you already have a favorite saint, ask yourself; "Do I know about my favorite saint's life yet?" If not, order a book about your favorite saint and commit to learning about him or her so you can witness to your favorite saint better!

Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner



Third Sunday of Advent: Isaiah 61:1-2, 10-11; Luke 1:46-66; John 1:6-8, 28, 19-17

Prayer of the Day: Give us strength; bulid up our courage, mighty God, because we are sometimes weak and afraid. You sent Jesus to make the sick better and to be a friend of the poor. May we believe in him and be happy that you always support us. We pray to you through Jesus, our Lord.

Good news for the poor! Christ, our Light, is among us!

How does light make you feel? How does darkness make you feel? Is light better? Of course light makes us all feel better. God knows that so He sent us the light through His Son. Knowing that light is coming and darkness will end is a great feeling. This is what we see as we read from Isaiah. John the Baptizer in John's Gospel also shares the importance of being a light to others. Being a light to others can mean being an example for others to follow so they know what to do and which direction to follow to reach God. As children, there are many things you can do.
