

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...



Merry Christmas!

In one of my favorite classic movies, there is a scene in which a psychiatrist gives advice to his new patient. (Paraphrased) He say's; "I am going to write you a prescription." The patient replies; "No Doctor, I don't want to take any medicine." The psychiatrist then responds, "This is not physical medicine." "I am writing you a prescription to take a vacation from your problems!" When you start to experience the worry and troubles you normally struggle with, I want you to take this piece of paper out, read it and follow it to the letter...Doctors orders!" The patient then replies with a big smile; "This is great! Take a vacation from my problems!"

The wilderness of life on earth can bring forth many anxieties. If there is a season in the liturgical year that is best suited to teach us to take a break from our normal earthly concerns, it is the Christmas season. The Miracle of God's intervention in human history to bring forth our freedom by the mystery of the Incarnation never gets old. In our human weakness, we allow earthly concerns to create haze over our acceptance of this gift, but it is never *old news*.

You might wonder how you can better embrace this gift of the Christmas season and take a vacation or perhaps a *Break* from earthly concerns! Here is a prayer break to help you do this: I invite you to Pray this prayer as I will every day during the Christmas season and beyond!

Lord Jesus Christ, you were given to us for our salvation, born of the Virgin Mary, and allowed yourself to be safeguarded by the Holy Saint Joseph. Help me to know and to love you more each day. Help me to better trust my life to you through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph!

- 1. **Blessings or Rewards:** (Name 5 small blessings or rewards the Lord has given you today)
- 2. **Empty:** (Name 5 ways you came up short or empty in living up to the Lord's call for you to be *Christlike* to-day) Just think; "What could I have done better or differently today)
- 3. Amen: Name 5 ways you did something right today. Think, "What are some ways I did do something *Christ-like* or generously today for someone else or remained faithful to prayer time! When I think of the small ways I *got it right* today by the Holy Spirit's help, I love to say; "Amen! Thank you Holy Spirit for the assistance and Grace to have done those things well, even the smallest of things!"
- 4. **Kick:** For this part, pray the sufferings of your day. Name 5 things you did not like (sufferings) and pray them by uniting them to the Lord's *Holy Wounds* on the Cross. I use the word *Kick* here because our sufferings can feel like a kick in the leg when we receive them. However, by praying them daily, we unite our sufferings to the Lord's *Holy Wounds* which produces fruit for us in our spiritual life and alleviates the weight of our daily sufferings!

Ephesians 3:20-21 - "To God whose power now at work in us can do immeasurably more than we ask or imagine, to Him be glory in the Church and in Christ Jesus through all generations, world without end. Amen."

Fourth Sunday of Advent: 2 Samuel 7:8-16; Psalm 89; Luke 1:26-38

Prayer of the Day: God, you chose ordinary people, common people, to make a home for Jesus. We want to make a home for him in our hearts; give us the love to do this, and let him be our brother, forever and ever.

Both of these readings shows us the power of God at work in human beings. In the second book of Samuel, God reminds King David that he was called by God to be a leader. David is also reminded that member of his family will be a great king. will be like a son to God, and that kingdom would last forever. Does this sound familiar? How about Luke's Gospel reading? An angel was sent to Mary who was engaged to Joseph from the familiy of David. The angel tells Mary that she has been blessed by God and will have a son. His name will be Jesus. He will be a rules of the family of David, and his kingdom will never end. Sound similar, don't they. We need to remember that the Old Testament and New Testament are tied together. These two stories are great examples of that.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - December 25, 2023 The Nativity of the Lord




"She gave birth to her firstborn son." The pain of childbirth is something that boggles my mind. I'm sure I couldn't handle it. I can't even watch scenes in movies in which a woman gives birth. I understand it's a beautiful part of nature, but there's still something awful about it and the attendant suffering.

Which is why it's worth pondering an often neglected and currently unpopular part of the Church's theology around the birth of Christ, his was miraculous because it caused no pain to his mother. Even her physical virginity remains intact. Of course, we modern scientific people scoff at such an idea.

Without obsessing over the obstetrical details, we discover a glorious illumination in the symbolic meaning of this birth that we moderns find so embarrassing. *God comes into the world in an utterly non-violent way.* He himself will suffer his own bloodshed but will never shed that of others. He is so peaceful and non-violent that he will even rise from the dead without breaking the seal of the tomb. All of humanity, in the Church, will give birth to him in the Church free from the terrible pain due to original sin. How badly we need the truth of this miraculous birth today!

Let's delight in this great mystery and miracle of Jesus's birth. He is the Prince of Peace and always nonviolent. We need not fear him, ever. — Father John Muir
