

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...

A prayerful exercise to examine my day and pray to the Lord about whether virtue or a lack of virtue better describes my day. The purpose is to pray about everything and grow from where I am in the spiritual life! For this exercise we use the 7 capitol sins or *deadly sins* and their opposite Virtues! Our goal in praying this often is to hopefully get to a point in which we are checking virtue boxes much more readily than capitol sin boxes!

I especially love to begin by asking the prayerful assistance of Saint Joseph; O Saint Joseph most Just, Chaste, Prudent, Courageous, Obedient, and faithful; pray for me to grow in virtue today!

The Capitol sins are on the left with examples and the Virtues are on the right side with examples!

Gluttony_____ (I fill up on earthly things) Temperance____ (I consume things of this world only in proper portions and I seek to consume things that help my faith rather than cause temptations toward sin)

Envy____ (I wish I had what someone else has) Love for neighbor____ (I am grateful for what I have and happy to see my neighbor receive good things)

Sloth_____ (I am unmotivated to work) Diligence_____ I trust the Holy Spirit will assist me when I try my best and work hard for God's kingdom!





Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner



Holy Family: Colossians 3:12-21

Prayer of the Day: God, you care for us and protect us like a mother and father. Teach us to be kind and patient, honest and gentle and most of all at peace with the people with whom we live. This is our prayer to you, through Jesus Christ, our Lod.

Our families are very important to us. Our families teach us to be who we are. Is it always easy being a family. No, it is not. But with caring, understanding and mutual respect and love, we can live together in a loving way. Look at the first reading from Colossians. It has a few basic rules for us to follow: be kind, be patient, be honest and gentle, forgive each other as God forgives us and love each other! Pretty straightforward instructions, but not always easy to follow. But if we help each other along the way, we can grow together as a loving family and be like the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner



Mary, Mother of God: Numbers 6:22-27; Numbers 6:24-26; Luke 2:16-21



Prayer of the Day: Loving God, through the power of your Spirit, you have made Mary the mother of your only Son, Jesus. In the name of Mary, we proclaim your glory. In the name of Jesus, our

Savior, we rejoice in the gift of your Spirit, and we bless your name, forever and ever.

Both readings today focus on the importance of our name. In the book of Numbers, God tells Moses to bless people in His name. In those times, the name stood for the whole person and so when Moses would bless in God's name, it would make God totally present to them. In Luke's gospel, it is talking about the naming of Jesus in the temple when he was circumcised. Again, in those times, the baby was not named until 8 days later. So when Joseph and Mary presented Jesus in the Temple, Jesus was named. The angel, Gabriel, told Mary to call him Jesus which means "Savior". Again, with a reference to the name being the "whole person", scripture tells us that "at the name of Jesus, every knee should bend" and "those who call upon the name of the Lord will be saved". This feast celebrates the name of Jesus and also proclaims that "Jesus is Savior!"
