

### Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner





Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: 1Samuel 3:1-11, 19; Psalm 40; John 1:35-42

**Prayer of the Day:** God, you love all people and want them to know Jesus, your Son. Make us wide awake to your voice and always prepared to do what pleases you. We ask this through Jesus, you Son.

Do you have a calling? What is a calling? The reading in 1 Samuel will show us. This reading is about Eli, a priest from Jerusalem, who was going blind. He took care of the Temple but needed help. Samuel took care of Eli and kept the Temple light burning. One night, Samuel was getting ready to sleep when he heard someone call his name. Samuel went to Eli to see what he wanted, but it was not Eli who had called him. Eli told him to go back to sleep. This happened a few more times when Eli realized that it was God calling Samuel. So the next time God called, Samuel said: "Speak to me Lord, I am listening!" So, God told Samuel that he was about to do something to make everyone take notice. From then on Samuel stayed close to God, and God made Samuel a great leader of the people. Jesus did the same to gather the apostles close to him as you see in John's gospel. As he found people, Jesus would ask them to leave what they were doing and follow up. In both stories, those being called to serve had to listen closely to hear the calling. We all must be open to our calling. Some are called to be married. Some to be priests. Some to be single. God knows what is best suited for us. So let us be open to God's voice and answer him....

Here I am: I come to do your will.

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION - January 14, 2024 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

As a priest, I'm amazed how happily married couples remember the tiniest details of their earliest encounters. They effort-lessly report things like: "he wore a blue shirt," "we ordered brussels sprouts," "her hair was up in a bun," and "he spilled shrimp cocktail sauce at my family's open front door when it was ten degrees below zero," (that one's courtesy of my mom). We delight in remembering and speaking of when our new life of love began. The little details are glorious reminders that it's all *real*.

It's similar for John the Apostle. He tells us of the two disciples who followed Jesus into his house, "...they stayed with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon." Why does that tiny detail matter? Because that's the time of day when they encountered the love of Jesus the Messiah in their lives. Our religion is not primarily about abstract truths about God, no matter how true or sublime. It is about God meeting & saving us in our human nature. It's about a human relationship.

What was the time of day when you first recall encountering Christ and his Church? Who was there? What did you feel? How did things look and smell? What happened? Take some time to recall it in detail. For me, it was inside an old, rickety church on a hillside in Jerome, Arizona. It was about 9 p. m. on a Saturday evening. I was with my friends Jenny, Brad, and Laura. We were praying, singing, and laughing. When was it for you? Remembering the details isn't empty nostalgia. It reminds us now that God's love for us in our humanity is real. — Father John Muir
