



Third Sunday in Ordinary Time: Jonah 3:1-5, 10; Psalm 25; Mark 1:14-20

Prayer of the Day: God, you are ready to forgive us whenever we do wrong. Give us the courage to be sorry for our faults and so open up our hearts to your love. We ask you this through Jesus, the Lord.

The readings today from Jonah and Mark have a common thread. Both share the same message that we are to repent and believe. God tells Jonah to travel to Ninevah with the message the city will be destroyed in 40 days if the people did not repent (repent means to be sorry for anything you did wrong and try not to do it again). Amazingly, the very first day the people there believed Jonah and started to fast and do penance since they were truly sorry for all the wrong they had done. God kept his promise and did not destroy the city. Mark's gospel is similar except Jesus is the one doing the calling. As Jesus calls to Simon, Andrew, James and John, he tells them to leave their boats and follow him. He proclaimed the Good News to the people by saying: "The time you have been waiting for has come! Change your lives and believe in the Good News!" What does that mean to change our lives and follow the good news? It means we need to do what is right and follow Jesus example. Was it always easy for Jesus to do what was right? No. But, He did it because he knew it was what God the Father expected of Him as well as all of us. However, when we slip up, remember we can always go to confession and ask for forgiveness and start over. Jesus always loves us and forgives us.
