Father Jim's Thoughts for the week...



Fourth Sunday Ordinary Time

Have you heard of a risk and reward system? Have you heard of this applied to your spiritual life? Did you know that it takes a habit of taking risks in order to grow in the spiritual life? Saint Paul says in our second reading today, "I want you to be free from anxieties." (1 Corinthians: 32)

In the context of this letter, he is addressing matters related to marriage and single life for Christians in the first century. For our ears, I would like to highlight this verse in the letter. (1 Corinthians: 7:35) "I say this for your own benefit, not to lay any restraint upon you, but to promote good order and to secure your undivided devotion to the Lord."

Did you know that it is difficult to have an undivided devotion to the Lord without taking risks for the Lord? Did you know that, generally speaking, anxiety tends to grow when we only take the easy paths in our day? The Saints took much time to develop what we would consider an undivided heart, and even the Saints would say they still struggled while in this life. So, I might ask myself these questions to judge the level of division in my heart to know where I might need some spiritual growth:

Do I faithfully spend time with God in prayer everyday? _____

Do I regularly read Catholic books that help my understanding of the faith? _____

Do I seek and embrace opportunities to be charitable toward others? _____

Do I take risks for the Lord _____ or do I choose the easy path more readily? _____

Most of us prefer an easy path in our day. That is human nature. Yet to grow, we must take some risks for the Lord regularly. What is a risk for the Lord? Doing something for the Lord that I can't easily predict the outcome. Examples? Talking about my faith to someone who might not be receptive to it. Engaging in public prayer like the rosary or praying before meals. Saying no to things that are spiritually unhealthy for me like Gossip. A good rule of thumb is to try and make a habit of taking some small risk that is a good thing to do for the Lord each day.

May we all grow closer to the Lord by embracing the small risks that the Lord calls us to take each day for His Glory and for our benefit in the spiritual life!
