

Sacrament of Baptism: By appointment. Catechesis is required.



Parish Registration/New Members: If you are new in the parish, we welcome you and invite you to complete a confidential census form to complete your membership. Parish membership is required to be a sponsor, to get married in the parish, or to have a child baptized.

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...



Saint Bonaventure says, "What is more, the extent of our faith is the measure of the wisdom which God has given us. Thus, no one should overestimate his wisdom; instead, he should soberly make his assessment according to the extent of the faith which God has given him."

I like to remember that the Lord is calling me to embrace the faith that He has given me to do His Will with the tools He has given me. What does this mean for my spiritual anxiety? It means that too often I, and we all, might become stressed trying to figure out a spiritual puzzle the Lord didn't give us to solve. The teaching of Christ's Church on earth is the roadmap we are given to navigate this wilderness of life, but without faith, that roadmap can quickly become faded and blurry and lack potency. Nothing replaces time with our Lord in prayer to gain that potency back when we are too overwhelmed in life. The more I pray, the more I learn how to pray. I only ever learn how to pray, well by first, knowing what it feels like to pray poorly through experience. So, pray with me today and don't overthink it. Just dive right in!

God our Father, I profess my faith in your Holy Name. I know you see much farther than I can on the path of my life. These recent things are currently causing me stress in my life. I name them now to you

I also know that you are working out all things at the Holy Spirit's pace, which is much slower than my distracted mind. These are signs of hope you have recently given me; , , , . I see them, I receive them, I trust in Your Holy Will.

Lord, you afford me challenges in this life so that I learn to grow and become a little detached from false earthly promises and stretch my earthly comfort zones ...learning to trust in you. Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19; 22-23; Psalm 40; Mark 1:29-39

Prayer of the Day: Caring God, to make this world happy and peaceful as you want it we must work hard at loving and helping all people. See how weak we are; make us strong to do your work, because without you we can do nothing. We ask you to do this through Jesus, you Son.

First Corinthians is Paul writing to them. He explains the reason he preaches is because God told him to. Paul also says that he feels God calling him so strongly that he cannot say no. We have to remember that Paul was a strong believer in his Jewish faith, and so would persecute anyone who followed Jesus. That is until one day Jesus appeared to Paul and changed his life completely. Paul wants us to have that same feeling of healing and salvation. Mark's gospel has a healing story as well, but a different kind. Jesus is visiting Simon and Andrew and find their mother ill. Jesus goes to her and takes her by the hand. She is immediately well and starts to serve everyone there. The news of her healing spread quickly, and that evening many people came to be healed by Jesus. The next morning Jesus went off to pray alone. When Simon found him, Jesus said it was time to travel to other towns and share the Good News with the others. So, Jesus began his teaching around Galilee.
