

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...





Third Sunday of Easter

A priest I know was once asked, "Father, how do you keep the fire of the Holy Spirit burning in your heart? How do you maintain enough joy to carry on with the mission Jesus Christ has called you too when the affirmation of God doesn't seem to be there (or) when the Lord doesn't seem to be answering your prayers or providing the miracles you need?"

The priest, after thinking about this question, said in reply, "You are describing the many wilderness hikes of life. In these periods, I have learned that I can't force God's timing to provide what I think I need for the mission or for my own spiritual affirmation. So, instead of focusing on what the Lord has not yet provided, I focus on little victories (small affirmations from the Lord or signs of hope by his presence, and I stop worrying so much about perfect formulas of wording and I try to preach more authentically, read scripture more openly, and take any opportunity I can to visit the sick, or feed someone in need especially the lost, the forgotten, the wheel that is not squeaky, so to speak, but needs just as much grease as the squeaky wheel). I find this formula to be very helpful in times of wilderness.

I have grown to recognize that God gives us wilderness hikes in life so that we receive the gift of entering deeper into *His* Plan. The Lord loves when we feed each other with witness and faith and charity. Often, I, and all of us can become spoiled, even in the spiritual life, by becoming accustomed to the Lord's goodness. But, we never grow without the wilderness hikes in life."

...When I share this brief answer the priest gave to a common guestion, I love to conclude it with my favorite quote from Saint Ephrem, deacon...

"Be glad then that you are overwhelmed, and do not be saddened that he has overcome you. A thirsty man is happy when he is drinking, and he is not depressed because he cannot exhaust the spring. So let this spring quench your thirst, and not your thirst the spring. For if you can satisfy your thirst without exhausting the spring, then when you thirst again you can drink from it once more; but if when your thirst is sated the spring is also dried up, then your victory would turn to your own harm. Be thankful then for what you have received, and do not be saddened at all that such an abundance still remains. What you have received and attained is your present share, while what is left will be your heritage."

Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner



Third Sunday of Easter: Acts 3:13-15; 17, 19; Psalm 118; Luke 24:35-48

Prayer of the Day: God always true, after you raised Jesus from death, he has been with us, even though we cannot see him. Let us hear his voice as he speaks to us secretly in our prayers; let us feel him near us when we gather together in the church. Stay with us; keep close to us through Jesus, who lives with you, forever and ever.

Hope you are having a very Blessed Easter season. Even though it has been a couple of weeks since we celebrated Easter Sunday, todays readings also talk about the Resurrection of Jesus. Today's reading is Peter talking to the people reminding them of what they had done and how they had influenced Pilate's decision. But, Peter reminds them also they did not understand what they were doing and to ask forgiveness. That is what Jesus was all about - forgiveness. That is why He died on the cross so that our sins may be forgiven. Today's gospel reading does the same as Jesus meets two disciples on the road to Emmaus. They did not realize it was Jesus until He explained the scriptures regarding the Resurrection and told them *they were now witnesses to all of this*. What an amazing conversation!

GOSPEL MEDITATION - April 14, 2024 3rd Sunday of Easter

When I was a kid, a friend at my home parish told me, "If you get to Mass by the Gospel reading, it counts!" As a lifelong late-arriver, it's something I have told myself many times, especially in my earlier years as a Catholic. If the "it counts" is justifiable on a pathetically minimal scale of liturgical legalism, then the Gospel reading today shows how insanely wrong-headed it is, and how helpful it is to re-think the Mass in its light.

The famous "Road to Emmaus" story recounts, on that first Sunday of the Resurrection, the basic two-fold structure of the Mass: *Word*, followed by *Eucharist*. Jesus spends a significant period of time with two dismayed disciples, as he connects a wide swath of the Hebrew scriptures with his own suffering, death, and resurrection. They would later report that this Liturgy of the Word touched their hearts with an inexplicable fire. This Word-induced flame alone is what leads the two disciples to discover Jesus' presence in the "breaking of the bread."

With this in mind, how can we possibly think that the Liturgy of the Word is unnecessary or incidental? The two disciples needed the Scriptures explained to them in order to experience Jesus alive in the eucharistic breaking of bread. Sure, we say, but they had the Risen Jesus. But that's precisely the point: Jesus is risen and accompanies us in both parts of the Mass. Imagine how much our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist would deepen if we (preachers and listeners) took even more seriously that Jesus himself sets our hearts ablaze with his Word *so that* we know him in the Eucharist. That Word-induced fire counts, too! — *Father John Muir*






