

Father Jim's Thoughts for the week ...



Do you pray on a Mountain Top?




Which one of these forms of prayer is better; memorized recitation, or speaking from the heart to the Lord?

Answer: Both! Structured prayers that have been given to us over generations produce great fruit when done regularly. Speaking to the Lord openly and listening for His clarity also produces great fruit. Your prayer life might look different than mine in structure, but we share something greatly in common; only the Holy Spirit can purify, shape and strengthen a person's prayer life. I find that I need to let the Holy Spirit adjust things for me at least once a month. How? I ask the Holy Spirit in Holy Hour before the new month begins to give me something to work on, a new focus or adjustment! It takes me a few days of asking and usually by the third time I gain a simple yet tangible new focus for the month ahead. I don't always keep to it but that's what the next month is for! And so on!

The best pro-tip about a good prayer life is that it's not a mystery. Sure, there is a whole universe of good prayers and novenas to find, but every Saint and every beginner in the spiritual life shares one thing in common. Good things always start with a daily habit of time spent with God without distraction. That's one of the reasons God always seems to speak on a Mountain Top to people in Holy Scripture, because the prophet always hears the Lord most clearly when away from earthly distractions. Let your quiet place for prayer be your mountain top and give the Holy spirit every chance you can to form you in this life!

Saint Augustine once wrote, "No one can be ready for the next life unless he trains himself for it now. We have been promised something we do not yet possess, and because the promise was made by one who keeps His word, we trust him and are glad; but insofar as possession is delayed, we can only long and yearn for it. It is good for us to persevere in longing until we receive what was promised, and when yearning is over; then praise alone will remain."

Children's Liturgy of the Word Corner



Fourth Sunday of Easter: Acts 4:8-12; Psalm 118; John 10:11-18



Prayer of the Day: Loving Lord, you sent Jesus to give us real life, your life. Because we belong to you, help us live as your children and follow Jesus by loving others and caring for those who need help. As his sisters and brothers, may we always recognize his voice when he calls us and leads us to you. We ask you to do this through the very same Jesus, who lives with you, forever and ever.

As always there are two readings. The first is Peter asking the people why they want to understand how the crippled man was healed when they were the very people who wanted Jesus put to death. The second talks about the Good Shepherd. Not many of us today know what a shepherd it or even how important he was during the time of Jesus. Everyone had sheep grazing in the fields and each owner had a shepherd to protect their sheep. But, this shepherd was just a "hired hand" to watch the sheep and sometimes they did not take it very seriously. John explains that Jesus is the "Good Shepherd" because He knows all of his sheep by name and they know Him as well. Sheep come to know the voice of person who protects them and they follow them readily. We too are familiar with Jesus' voice and want to follow him readily. Let us continue to listen for Jesus' voice in all that we do. Where do we hear this voice? We hear it through those who teach us about Jesus: parents, teachers, priests and others who share the faith. Jesus says: "I am the Good Shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me"

GOSPEL MEDITATION - April 21, 2024 4th Sunday of Easter

Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line. When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "I know my own and my own know me," and "I lay down my life for the sheep." Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me — and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby — blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us. — Father John Muir
