

A Preparation Prayer for Divine Mercy Sunday

"Risen Lord, today I am most anxious about _____. Please bring about good in this thing and grant that the outcome is in accordance with Your Will and does not become a cross too heavy for me to carry. I ask to be fed with your spiritual food from heaven so that I have the energy to grow in confidence in you alone.

Entrusting this to you, I now pray about how I can be humble today (or tomorrow if your praying at night) and better receive your clarity in all things". (Name your plans for the day to the Lord at this time)

As you name these out loud in prayer or in silence, let the Holy spirit prompt you to re-evaluate if some of these plans could use an increase in humility or charity or a decrease in pride Lord, I know that it takes strength to be humble, not weakness. Help me to speak charitably today while faithfully embracing opportunities to glorify you in my interactions with the people on my path today.

Wisdom 3: 18-22a

"The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself; so you will find favor with God. There are many who are noble and renowned, but it is to the humble that he reveals his mysteries. For great is the might of the Lord; he is glorified by the humble. Seek not what is too difficult for you, nor investigate what is beyond your power. Reflect upon what has been assigned to you."

GOSPEL MEDITATION - April 7, 2024 2nd Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy)

A protestant pastor friend of mine was invited to meet Pope Francis with a group of other pastors. He noticed the Pope's chair was especially ornate and set at the head of the group. He somewhat playfully said, "Holy Father, why do *you* get that special chair?" The group chuckled nervously at my friend's audacious chide.

The following year, the group was invited to return. They entered the room to find only simple chairs placed in a circle. Pope Francis entered, sat down in one of the humble chairs and, looking directly at my friend, with a twinkle in his eye, asked, "What do you think of my chair now?" My friend was stunned that the Pope remembered his concerns — and took the time to answer them.

Thomas the apostle was certainly stunned by the Risen Jesus displaying his wounds in person. But he also must have been equally shocked that Jesus knew and answered his particular questions, worries, and even demands related to his faith. How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realize God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them.

What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? Like Thomas, will you be bold enough to voice them this week? How wonderful to know that if we do so, God will remember and respond even to our most audacious desires. — *Father John Muir*




